- V. **New Complaints:**
  - A. **CRB 2021-0014:** Complaint filed: 1/10/2021; Incident: 12/6/2020. The Complainant alleges that he saw someone across the street from his house trying to steal a car. The Complainant yelled at them and they shot at the Complainant, who then called the police. When the police arrived, they investigated the Complainant's own gun, which still smelled like gunpowder because he had recently been at the shooting range. The officers were not wearing masks. The Complainant asked them to leave, but they wouldn't. The officers told the Complainant that they thought he was lying about the incident. The Complainant willingly gave his gun to the officers. The Complainant would like his gun back.
  - B. **CRB 2021-0013:** Complaint filed with PIB: 9/11/2020; Incident: 4/9/2020. The Complainant alleges that she was in her car when she decided to park it so she could check her tires for glass. The Complainant left the car keys on top of the dashboard while she checked **the** tires so she wouldn't misplace them. The Complainant was then approached by BPD officers who asked if they could talk to her. When she said "no," the officers said she had an unaccompanied vehicle. The Complainant was arrested and her car was searched. The officers used excessive force when forcing her down to the ground.
- VI. **Completed Cases:**
  - A. **CRB2018-0088/PIB2018-0355:** Complaint filed: 6/18/2018; Incident: 6/18/2018; Allegations: Harassment and Abusive Language. The complaint alleges that a vehicle cut the Complainant off as he was exiting a gas station, the Complainant gave them the finger for cutting him off, and then the vehicle pulled up in front of the Complainant's vehicle to stop the Complainant's vehicle from moving. The Complainant believes that it was an off-duty or undercover BPD officer. During the interaction, the individual stated to the Complainant: "fuck you," and called the Complainant a "punk ass bitch." Further, the individual threatened the Complainant by placing his hand on his gun and motioning to a badge on his hip. The investigation determined that it was not a BPD officer, but a special police officer certified for the State of Maryland and has a gun permit.
  - B. **CRB2018-0135/PIB2018-0502:** PIB Final Report only. Complainant filed: 8/28/2018; Incident: 8/22/2018; Allegations: Harassment. The Complainant alleges that she was sitting on a brick wall with her grandson when two officers approached her and told her to leave because she was loitering. The officers had

been watching her sit on the brick wall for an hour before approaching her and there were other people loitering in the area, but the officers only approached her. The Complainant feels harassed by one of the two officers because the officer is always approaching her and during one such incident, wrote the Complainant four traffic tickets but only issued two of them.

- C. **CRB2019-0103/PIB2019-0639:** Incident: 4/6/2019; Complaint filed: 4/24/2019; Allegation: Abusive Language. On 4/6/2019, the Complainant approached a man sitting in his car talking on his phone outside of the Complainant's business. The complaint alleges that the man acted belligerently towards the Complainant, which prompted the Complainant to want to call the police. The man then identified himself as a police officer and told the Complainant to "mind [her] own fucking business." PIB did not provide a Final Report.
  - D. **CRB2019-0112/PIB2019-0865:** Incident: 5/8/2019; Complaint filed: 5/16/2019; Allegation: Harassment. On 5/8/2019, the Complainant was pulled over by BPD officers and a disagreement occurred causing the Complainant to request a supervisor. The Complainant had been pulled over by the same BPD officer on 4/30/2019 and issued a repair order. The Complainant was not issued a citation at the 5/8/2019 traffic stop. Body-worn camera footage of the 4/30/2019 and 5/8/2019 traffic stops were provided and reviewed by the CRB Investigator. PIB did not provide a Final Report.
  - E. **CRB 2020-0002/PIB 2020-0168:** Complaint filed: 2/6/2020; Incident: 2/3/2020; Allegations: Harassment and False Imprisonment. The complaint alleges that on 2/3/2020, the Complainant was driving for Uber when he was struck by a BPD vehicle while turning onto Water Street in downtown Baltimore. When officers arrived at the scene of the accident, the Complainant told the officers that he was being harassed by the BPD because he had previously filed a complaint against them. The Complainant was arrested at the accident scene because there was a warrant for his arrest. He was released 30-45 minutes later because the warrant wasn't for him; he was returned to his vehicle. The Complainant believes that the car accident was staged and was apart of the harassment. PIB provided: Final Report, BWC footage, and an officer gave a statement to the CRB Investigator.
  - F. **CRB2018-0140/PIB2018-0508:** Case reviewed at the November CRB meeting. Board requested further investigation (BWC/CCTV) to make final decision.
