Civilian Review Board of Baltimore City Semi-Annual Statistical Report January 1, 2007 through June 30, 2007

In the six month period from January 1, 2007 through June 30, 2007, the Civilian Review Board reviewed <u>54</u> completed investigations submitted by the Internal Affairs Division of the Baltimore Police Department. The Board reviewed no completed investigations from the Baltimore School Police, Sheriff's Office, or Housing authority of Baltimore. The total number of allegations reviewed by the Board for the period was <u>118</u>. The total number of complaints reviewed was <u>54</u>.

Of the 54 complaints reviewed for the period, none was actually filed during this period.

Of the <u>60</u> allegations of excessive force reviewed by the Board, the Law Enforcement Agency involved found that <u>1</u> of the allegations was UNFOUNDED, <u>55</u> were NOT SUSTAINED, <u>2</u> were EXONERATED, and <u>2</u> were SUSTAINED. For the same <u>60</u> allegations of Excessive Force, the Civilian Review Board found <u>50</u> were NOT SUSTAINED, <u>0</u> EXONERATED, and <u>8</u> were SUSTAINED. <u>2</u> resulted in a TIE-VOTE (no recommendation made).

Of the <u>42</u> allegations of Abusive Language reviewed by the Board, the Law Enforcement Agency involved found that <u>1</u> was UNFOUNDED, <u>39</u> were NOT SUSTAINED, and <u>2</u> were SUSTAINED. For the same <u>42</u> allegations of Abusive Language the Civilian Review Board found <u>37</u> were NOT SUSTAINED, <u>1</u> was EXONERATED, and <u>4</u> were SUSTAINED.

Of the <u>16</u> allegations of Harassment reviewed by the Board, the Law Enforcement Agency involved found that <u>6</u> of the allegations were NOT SUSTAINED, <u>10</u> were UNFOUNDED, and <u>0</u> were SUSTAINED. For the same <u>16</u> allegations of Harassment, the Civilian Review Board found <u>15</u> were NOT SUSTAINED, <u>1</u> EXONERATED, and <u>0</u> was SUSTAINED.

Civilian Review Board of Baltimore City Semi-Annual Statistical Report July 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007

In the six month period from July 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007, the Civilian Review Board reviewed 53 completed investigations submitted by the Internal Affairs Division of the Baltimore Police Department. The Board reviewed no completed investigations from the Baltimore School Police, Sheriff's Office, or Housing authority of Baltimore. The total number of allegations reviewed by the Board for the period was 117. The total number of complaints reviewed was 53.

Of the 53 complaints reviewed for the period, none was actually filed during this period.

Of the <u>53</u> allegations of excessive force reviewed by the Board, the Law Enforcement Agency involved found that <u>2</u> of the allegations was UNFOUNDED, <u>49</u> were NOT SUSTAINED, <u>2</u> were EXONERATED, and <u>0</u> was SUSTAINED. For the same <u>53</u> allegations of Excessive Force, the Civilian Review Board found <u>45</u> were NOT SUSTAINED, <u>1</u> EXONERATED, and <u>6</u> were SUSTAINED.

Of the <u>39</u> allegations of Abusive Language reviewed by the Board, the Law Enforcement Agency involved found that $\underline{1}$ was UNFOUNDED, $\underline{38}$ were NOT SUSTAINED, and $\underline{0}$ was SUSTAINED. For the same $\underline{39}$ allegations of Abusive Language the Civilian Review Board found $\underline{33}$ were NOT SUSTAINED, $\underline{0}$ was EXONERATED, and $\underline{6}$ were SUSTAINED.

Of the <u>25</u> allegations of Harassment reviewed by the Board, the Law Enforcement Agency involved found that <u>11</u> of the allegations were NOT SUSTAINED, <u>14</u> were UNFOUNDED, and <u>0</u> were SUSTAINED. For the same <u>25</u> allegations of Harassment, the Civilian Review Board found <u>23</u> were NOT SUSTAINED, <u>1</u> EXONERATED, and <u>1</u> was SUSTAINED.

During this same period (July 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007) $\underline{98}$ complaints were received by the Civilian Review Board against members of the Baltimore City Police Department. There were $\underline{0}$ complaints filed against the School Police, Sheriff's Office, and Housing Authority Police.

Of the <u>98</u> complaints processed by the Board, a simultaneous investigation was requested to be done by the Board's investigators on <u>60</u> complaints.

The <u>98</u> complaints contacted approximately <u>169</u> allegations.

The <u>98</u> complaints processed in this review period compares with <u>74</u> filed in the preceding six-month period.
