

**Civilian Review Board of Baltimore City**  
**Semi-Annual Statistical Report**  
**January 1, 2007 through June 30, 2007**

In the six month period from January 1, 2007 through June 30, 2007, the Civilian Review Board reviewed 54 completed investigations submitted by the Internal Affairs Division of the Baltimore Police Department. The Board reviewed no completed investigations from the Baltimore School Police, Sheriff's Office, or Housing authority of Baltimore. The total number of allegations reviewed by the Board for the period was 118. The total number of complaints reviewed was 54.

Of the 54 complaints reviewed for the period, none was actually filed during this period.

Of the 60 allegations of excessive force reviewed by the Board, the Law Enforcement Agency involved found that 1 of the allegations was UNFOUNDED, 55 were NOT SUSTAINED, 2 were EXONERATED, and 2 were SUSTAINED. For the same 60 allegations of Excessive Force, the Civilian Review Board found 50 were NOT SUSTAINED, 0 EXONERATED, and 8 were SUSTAINED. 2 resulted in a TIE-VOTE (no recommendation made).

Of the 42 allegations of Abusive Language reviewed by the Board, the Law Enforcement Agency involved found that 1 was UNFOUNDED, 39 were NOT SUSTAINED, and 2 were SUSTAINED. For the same 42 allegations of Abusive Language the Civilian Review Board found 37 were NOT SUSTAINED, 1 was EXONERATED, and 4 were SUSTAINED.

Of the 16 allegations of Harassment reviewed by the Board, the Law Enforcement Agency involved found that 6 of the allegations were NOT SUSTAINED, 10 were UNFOUNDED, and 0 were SUSTAINED. For the same 16 allegations of Harassment, the Civilian Review Board found 15 were NOT SUSTAINED, 1 EXONERATED, and 0 was SUSTAINED.

**Semi-Annual Statistical Report**  
**July 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007**

In the six month period from July 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007, the Civilian Review Board reviewed 53 completed investigations submitted by the Internal Affairs Division of the Baltimore Police Department. The Board reviewed no completed investigations from the Baltimore School Police, Sheriff's Office, or Housing authority of Baltimore. The total number of allegations reviewed by the Board for the period was 117. The total number of complaints reviewed was 53.

Of the 53 complaints reviewed for the period, none was actually filed during this period.

Of the 53 allegations of excessive force reviewed by the Board, the Law Enforcement Agency involved found that 2 of the allegations was UNFOUNDED, 49 were NOT SUSTAINED, 2 were EXONERATED, and 0 was SUSTAINED. For the same 53 allegations of Excessive Force, the Civilian Review Board found 45 were NOT SUSTAINED, 1 EXONERATED, and 6 were SUSTAINED.

Of the 39 allegations of Abusive Language reviewed by the Board, the Law Enforcement Agency involved found that 1 was UNFOUNDED, 38 were NOT SUSTAINED, and 0 was SUSTAINED. For the same 39 allegations of Abusive Language the Civilian Review Board found 33 were NOT SUSTAINED, 0 was EXONERATED, and 6 were SUSTAINED.

Of the 25 allegations of Harassment reviewed by the Board, the Law Enforcement Agency involved found that 11 of the allegations were NOT SUSTAINED, 14 were UNFOUNDED, and 0 were SUSTAINED. For the same 25 allegations of Harassment, the Civilian Review Board found 23 were NOT SUSTAINED, 1 EXONERATED, and 1 was SUSTAINED.

During this same period (July 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007) 98 complaints were received by the Civilian Review Board against members of the Baltimore City Police Department. There were 0 complaints filed against the School Police, Sheriff's Office, and Housing Authority Police.

Of the 98 complaints processed by the Board, a simultaneous investigation was requested to be done by the Board's investigators on 60 complaints.

The 98 complaints contacted approximately 169 allegations.

The 98 complaints processed in this review period compares with 74 filed in the preceding six-month period.
