## CIVILIAN REVIEW BOARD of BALTIMORE CITY Semi-Annual Statistical Report Summary January 1, 2012 – June 30, 2012

In the sixth-month period from January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012, the Civilian Review Board received  $\underline{49}$  citizen complaints filed against members of the Baltimore Police Department. During this same period, the Board received  $\underline{3}$  complaints against members of the Baltimore Public School System Police. There were  $\underline{0}$  filed against the Sheriff's Office and the Housing Authority Police.

Of the  $\underline{52}$  total complaints received, the Board requested a simultaneous investigation to be conducted by its investigators on  $\underline{29}$  complaints.

The <u>52</u> complaints received contained <u>79</u> total allegations: <u>28</u> excessive force, <u>18</u> abusive language, 14 harassment, 13 false arrest, 6 false imprisonment.

The  $\underline{52}$  complaints received by the board during the period compare with  $\underline{50}$  filed in the preceding six-month period (July 1, 2010-December 31, 2010).

In the six-month period from January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012 the Civilian Review Board reviewed  $\underline{47}$  completed investigations against members of the Baltimore Police Department. The Board reviewed  $\underline{2}$  completed investigations against members of the Baltimore School Police. There were  $\underline{0}$  reviews against members of the Housing Authority Police, or Sheriff's Office during this period.

Of the <u>49</u> completed investigations reviewed during this period, none were actually filed during the period.

The  $\underline{49}$  completed investigations reviewed contained approximately  $\underline{32}$  allegations of excessive force,  $\underline{32}$  allegations of abusive language,  $\underline{6}$  allegations of harassment,  $\underline{16}$  allegations of false arrest, and  $\underline{7}$  allegations of false imprisonment, for a total of  $\underline{93}$  allegations or findings being reviewed.

Of the <u>93</u> findings (allegations) reviewed, the Civilian Review Board recommended that a not sustained finding by Internal Investigations be reversed to a sustained finding on 8 allegations. The Board voted to reverse the findings of IID on approximately <u>8%</u> of the allegations (findings) reviewed.
