## CIVILIAN REVIEW BOARD of BALTIMORE CITY Semi-Annual Statistical Report Summary July 1, 2012 – December 31, 2012

In the sixth-month period from July 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012, the Civilian Review Board received <u>34</u> citizen complaints filed against members of the Baltimore Police Department. During this same period, the Board received <u>0</u> complaints against members of the Baltimore Public School System Police and the Housing Authority Police. There were <u>1</u> filed against the Sheriff's Office.

Of the  $\underline{35}$  total complaints received, the Board requested a simultaneous investigation to be conducted by its investigators on  $\underline{29}$  complaints.

The  $\underline{35}$  complaints received contained  $\underline{78}$  total allegations:  $\underline{26}$  excessive force, 20 abusive language,  $\underline{10}$  harassment,  $\underline{12}$  false arrest,  $\underline{10}$  false imprisonment.

The  $\underline{35}$  complaints received by the board during the period compare with  $\underline{52}$  filed in the preceding six-month period (January 1, 2012 – June 30, 2012).

In the six-month period from July 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012 the Civilian Review Board reviewed  $\underline{56}$  completed investigations against members of the Baltimore Police Department. The Board reviewed  $\underline{3}$  completed investigations against members of the Baltimore School Police. There were  $\underline{0}$  reviews against members of the Housing Authority Police, or Sheriff's Office during this period.

Of the <u>59</u> completed investigations reviewed during this period, none were actually filed during the period.

The  $\underline{59}$  completed investigations reviewed contained approximately  $\underline{40}$  allegations of excessive force,  $\underline{35}$  allegations of abusive language,  $\underline{12}$  allegations of harassment,  $\underline{21}$  allegations of false arrest, and  $\underline{9}$  allegations of false imprisonment, for a total of  $\underline{117}$  allegations or findings being reviewed.

Of the  $\underline{117}$  findings (allegations) reviewed, the Civilian Review Board recommended that a not sustained finding by Internal Investigations be reversed to a sustained finding on  $\underline{0}$  allegations. The Board voted to reverse the findings of IID on approximately  $\underline{0\%}$  of the allegations (findings) reviewed.
