CRB2018-0110- The complainant alleges harassment, false imprisonment and false arrest. The complainant alleges that at the direction of her son, who is a police officer, a group of officers removed her from her home and had her admitted to a hospital under false pretenses.

CRB2018-0115- The complainant alleges harassment. The complainant alleges that an officer approached him while he was walking home and followed him without reason. The complainant alleges the officer was insulting him and attempting to provoke a fight by making inappropriate comments about the complainant's sexuality. **Please note that although the Board voted to authorize the complaint for independent investigation, the CRB supervisor has recommended that they change their voted to IAD only, due to the limited amount of time to investigate the complaint before expiration. The case will expire on February 7, 2019.**

CRB2018-0228- The complainant alleges harassment, false arrest, false imprisonment and excessive force. The complainant alleges that officers removed him from his home and handcuffed him without cause while they searched his home. He alleged that he was taken to the hospital, where he fell unconscious because of the tightness of the handcuffs. He alleged that when he returned home, his money was missing.

CRB2018-0231- The complainant alleges false arrest. The complainant alleges that an undercover police officer approached her and requested sexual favors in exchange for payment. When the complainant complied, the police officer arrested her, but after allowing her to perform the sexual act, and then misrepresented the facts in the report.

CRB2018-0236- The complainant alleges harassment. The complainant alleges that officers who have previously pulled him over recognized him, followed him, and pulled him over a second time without cause.

CRB2019-0001-The complainant alleges harassment and abusive language. The complainant alleges that the officer was harassing her while she was in a shopping center, and that he had her car towed without cause.

CRB2019-0003-The complainant alleges harassment and false imprisonment. The complainant alleges that while driving with his family, an officer stopped his car for tinted windows, and when he produced a certification of his son’s medical condition that required tinted windows, the officer became aggressive, stating “I can do whatever I want” and continued to detain the family without cause.

CRB2019-0016-The complainant alleges harassment and false imprisonment. The complainant alleges that when she reported her car stolen, the responding officer reported her to ICE, and detained her until ICE arrived, and then continued to appear around her house with ICE officials.

The complainant alleged that officers falsely imprisoned and arrested him during a traffic stop.

The complainant alleged that when she called to report her car stolen, the responding officer issued her a citation. In response, the complainant requested to speak to a supervisor. Instead, officers then entered her home without a warrant and falsely arrested her with excessive force for refusing to sign a traffic citation. She also alleged that the officers neglected to inform her that they may arrest her for refusing to sign the citation.

The complainant alleged that the officer “deliberately, intentionally, and with malicious intent swore out a false statement of charges,” and falsely arrested him in an act of retaliation against his exertion of the First Amendment right to free speech. Further, he alleges that the same officer and a security officer are conspiring against him. He also provided an amendment to his complaint alleging that on a separate date, the officer accosted him. In this interaction, the officer allegedly asked the complainant to empty his pockets and gave him “a lecture” about trespassing. He claims this was in retaliation to his initial complaint.

The complainant alleges harassment. The complainant alleges that the officer has been continuously harassing her since 2008, including making false statements about her.

The complainant alleges the officers approached her son, searched him, and after he started running, the officers shot him four times and injured him. She also alleged that her son did not discharge a firearm at the officers because he did not possess a weapon.

The complainant alleges an officer approached her son, withdrew his firearm, and pointed it at her son without legal justification.

The complainant alleges excessive force. The complainant said that when he pulled over to help a shooting victim, officers responded to the scene and demanded that he stay and answer questions. The complainant gave them the information he had at the time and offered to provide his contact information so that they could follow-up with him later. When he walked to his car, officers arrested him and slammed him to the ground causing injury. Officers left him handcuffed on the ground for an hour and struck him repeatedly while pushing him into a squad car. Officer transported him to the hospital and then to jail, at which point an officer apologized, stating that what had occurred was unnecessary, but that he should have been more cooperative.
