- V. Commissioner's Report and Open Forum
 - Legislative Committee Mr. Adam Levine highlighted Bills that are being monitored: 1) Senate Bill (SB199)/House Bill (HB114) regarding infrastructure for the MTA. 2) Senate Bill (SB567)/House Bill (HB731) requiring the Medicaid Program to reimburse telehealth services. 3) Senate Bill (SB209)/House Bill (HB724) regarding prolonged school closures and educational services during emergencies for students with disabilities as well as services after graduation. 4) Senate Bill (SB431)/House Bill (HB534) regarding establishing a state Board of Sign language interpreters. 5) Senate Bill (SB300)/House Bill (HB714) requiring an individualized continuity education plan that would provide services after graduation. 6) Senate Bill (SB313)/House Bill (HB119) requiring the MD Department of

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> Health to educate providers regarding cognitive impairments including Alzheimer's and Dementia (Bill passed). 7) Senate Bill (SB161)/House Bill (HB244) regarding establishing a task force to study access in mental health and higher education. 8) Senate Bill (SB388) repeals the requirement to pay parking fees. 9) Senate Bill (SB371)/House Bill (HB716) gives parents the right to request an independent education program examination. 10) Senate Bill (SB98)/House Bill (HB155) relating to County Boards of education in public and nonpublic prekindergarten programs and schools to impose discrimination on those who receive State funds.

- iii. Ms. Huffman did a demonstration on how to use the closed caption in the Teams platform.
